
movement to do

NEWS FROM THE REGIONS

EASTERN CAPE: Port Elizabeth and Uitenhage

Helene Prince, supported by Tilly Crosbie

Helene Prince:

The Uitenhage Dance Company classes started on the 8th of February 2016. The adults and youth get together on a Monday and the kids on a Friday. We are 25 dancers at the moment but we are trusting the Lord for 40 members this year. New dancer are joining weekly and I believe this is truly

our time of breakthrough, restoration and elevation to a new level in dance. We will be starting the 6 months Basic Foundation Course in Christian Dance in March and we will have our 12th year celebration in July.

Our main aims for the new quarter is:

- to get the new dancers established in our foundation (what dance and our dance company is all about)
- for new dancers join CDFSA and old ones to renew their membership
- to attend CDFSA's first workshop the 9th of April and
- to establish new relationships with different dance groups







Tilly Crosbie:

"I am currently running the Christian Dance fellowship foundational course with The Hallelu dancers who meet on a weekly basis at Harvest Christian Church. I am a member of this team as well as a member of Harvest Christian Church and have been one for the past 18 years. We are currently 6 weeks into the Course and our ladies are finding it very beneficial. Furthermore we are also involved in outreaches to other churches when invited. Over the years our team have also been involved in a partnership with an organisation in Israel where we purchase baby clothing for new mothers who are experiencing financial difficulties. The organisation has a representative in PE who collects the



clothing. Through this representative we have also recently been involved in another project with victims of terror. We are supporting 2 teenage boys who have lost loved ones through acts of terror. The project is still running and we are busy filling 2 backpacks with various items for them such as toiletries, t-shirts and writing material. We do this as an act of love to show them that we are thinking of them during this difficult time. We also added a picture of our team in both backpacks and each dancer wrote a short message on the back of the card. Our doors are also open to any Christian dancer who is not a member of any particular dance group. Our members consist of all ages. The only requirement to join the Hallelu dancers is a heart to worship God through dance and movement".

GAUTENG: Message from Serena Reddy Melo, supported by Andrina Moodley

ACTS Dance Ministry led by Serena has been in existence since 2011. Classes are run every Monday

and we started our year on 8 February 2016. This team is open to all dancers outside of ACTS Christian Church. The team currently teams up with Acts of Love charity organization to do outreaches and evangelising. Throughout the year they get invited to minister in dance at many events. The first workshop in Gauteng is scheduled for 19 March 2016 from 8:30 – 14:00. The workshops planned are Funky Praise & Tambourine (Warren Stuart), Messianic dances and Liturgical worship. In January members of the Acts Dance Ministry participated in a "flash mob " that was done on and off the stage during the Praise & Worship and outside the church on a Sunday. Serena also participated in the Lead Like Jesus Encounter weekend which covered the Power of working in Unity in the Kingdom. She taught all the delegates the Unity dance "Hinei Ma Tov"

The team have also been requested to run a workshop for the Catholic Church. This came as

a result of their involvement in the J.A.M (Jesus and Me) event last year. Feedback from the crowd – "We have seen people dance before but never seen how bodies can be used to minister to people and to glorify God. We saw God through their dance".

A Gauteng based film company "New Wave Productions" which produces a light hearted youth orientated magazine show called i-Dentity on SABC 1 (broadcasts every Sunday at 11am), approached CDFSA enquiring about our activities. They were referred to ACTS Dance Ministry and interviews and filming will take place this month. We will let you know when the show will be aired.







WESTERN CAPE: Lisa Wilson, supported by Liesl Townsend

A CDFSA dance body will be established in the Western Cape this year. This will give dancers who are actively involved in dance ministries as well as those who do not belong to a particular dance troupe the opportunity to collaborate and support each other in the areas of dance training and development and the arts ministry. A preliminary look at the region in the area of Christian dance shows that there are many churches with dance groups that work in a variety of worship dance expressions. Establishing and growing CDFSA 's footprints in the Western Cape will be both exciting and challenging in order to be relevant, responsive and inclusive as much as possible. The opportunities for networking, collaborating and training in creative and technical movement expressions



for use in worship and in the service of God's kingdom through CDFSA, however, are real. Lisa is in preliminary discussions with various church dance groups in the Western Cape and the National CDFSA. Please free to send her any contacts for persons involved in dance ministry in the Western Cape.

KWA ZULU NATAL: Lecia Hale



Looking forward to seeing you in Ghana for the ICDF Conference in July 2016.


Seth Newman - Ghana

Workshop previews

Morning Stream: Children Teacher: Tove Liljedahl

This workshop stream will explore movements and ways to move, inspired by Laban methodology. We will look at how to lead children in your dance teaching in a way that helps them become familiar with a range of basic improvisation principles which are applicable for many dance techniques. You will also learn a choreography to a song which can be performed by many people. It will be helpful to all leaders of children and youth dance groups and it is open to trained and untrained dancers.

Afternoon Workshop: Healing
Proclaiming God's Goodness on the Journey
Teacher: Diane Hobelaid

Our lives are a journey. Through movement and imagery, we will find our Exodus experiences, and the signs of God's healing hand in our lives, through embodied story, dream and ritual in Christian context. We will work our stories together to create a moving tapestry, in which the movement from death to life, and life to death, brokenness to wholeness, slavery to freedom, is proclaimed together.

Getting to Ghana is




"Start by doing what is necessary; then do what is possible; and suddenly you are doing the impossible"
